Day 1: Venice

Arrive in Italy with a Stunning Introduction to Venice

The famous canals divide the city of Venice, drawing attention to the marble palaces soaring above the tranquil secluded waterways and leading to more than 400 bridges, which connect the various islands that create the elegant city. Vaporetti, gondolas, and speed boats glide down the famous waters of the Grand Canal that wind more than two miles through the cityscape. The familiar bell tower, which is known as the Campanile, towers above the rooftops and domes of St. Mark's Cathedral at 323 feet.



Your flight will land at Marco Polo Airport, where your private transfer will greet you upon arrival and escort you to your accommodation by a private boat. The opulence of the city on the lagoon will enchant you before you meet your guide in the hotel lobby. By now, you will be ready for an introduction to the classic beauty for which Venice is celebrated. The scent of dishes such as risi I bisi, risotto with peas and pancetta, baccala' mantecata, and dried salted codfish will drift from the restaurants and fill the winding, cobbled lanes.



Your guide will lead you to the famous St. Mark's Square to visit the fascinating architecture and artwork of the eponymous cathedral, which grew in importance in the 9th century after the remains of the saint were smuggled from Alexandria to Venice. Your guide will provide cultural, historical, and artistic commentary on the structure as they lead you from the captivating exterior into the breathtaking interior that is decorated with nearly 45,638 square feet of gilded Byzantine mosaics.

Day 2: Venice

Delight in a Classic Culinary and Hidden History Tour of Venice

You will meet your guide in the morning and walk to the growing, local crowd of the Rialto Market. The marketplace bustles with people who are searching for fresh produce and seafood. You can watch as merchants unload their goods from the barges along the lagoon near the edges of the renowned Rialto Bridge. The bridge was built in the 16th century after over a century and a half of wooden bridge's destruction, which was due to serving the busy crossing at the canal's midway point.



A form of the market has occurred in the plaza since the 11th century AD. You will wander through life in the market with sounds of active vendors who will call out to passersby. After visiting the marketplace, your guide will turn into a chef who then instructs you on the proper ways to prepare a traditional Venetian meal. You will follow along with the chef as a guide, learning the recipes of a customary three-course meal by preparing dishes like risotto al nero di seppia, risotto cooked in squid ink, or bigoli in salsa, which is a whole-wheat pasta that is cooked in a sauce of onions and salted fish.



The aromas of onion and simmering herbs will fill the kitchen as you shape your own menu that will be accompanied by delightful flavors of wines from the surrounding region of Veneto. In the evening, you will find a hidden history of the Venetian Republic that will be told through the cuisine of Cicchetti, which is a small dish that is typically served with an alcoholic beverage. Your guide will lead you through the quiet neighborhoods of the city that will be erupting with locals who are spilling out of the acclaimed bars that serve delicious, traditional plates.

Day 3: Venice

Revel in a Private Guided Tour of the Venetian Lagoon



After breakfast, you will board a private boat with your guide. You will be bound for the islands of Murano, Burano, and Torcello, beginning with the renowned island of Murano, which is known for its intricate, glassblowing tradition. A small canal winds across the island and resembles a smaller Venice. The bell tower of Chieso di San Pietro Martire rises above the main piazza of Campo Santo Stefano. Your guide will lead you to a private studio where you will meet an artisan who is a master at crafting handmade, colorful artwork.



The heat from the kiln will fill the studio as you learn the intricate methods that are required for heating, shaping, and molding the glass into the proper form before cooling.

The techniques were once coveted in Venice and moved to Murano in the 13th century by decree of the doge. The foundries produce everything from chandeliers to vases. You will continue to the island's main church and find stunning, mosaic flooring as it shines in the light.

Day 4: Verona

Cruise the Brenta Canal and Visit Padua en route to Verona



At breakfast, the aroma of espresso and fresh brioche will fill your dining room. Your private transfer will lead you outside of Venice to board a boat that will take you along the Brenta Canal, which is a 17-mile waterway that once used to transfer goods and aristocrats to the center of commerce during the Venetian Republic. Elegant villas line the banks where you can stop and enjoy the lavish lifestyles that are captured in the neoclassical and Baroque designs. You can stop at Villa Foscari, which is located on the picturesque waterway and is decorated with weeping willows. The gorgeous 16th-century villa has a reception floor, which is adorned with frescoes that depict mythological scenes from the epic Ovid.



You will reach the sophisticated city of Verona, which is situated on the banks of the River Adige. The charming city stems from the foundations of the 1st-century BC Roman colony. Upon your arrival, you will see the Roman Amphitheater as it rises out of Piazza Bra and dates back to the 3rd-century AD. The preserved structure contains 44 rows of seating that can accommodate 22,000 spectators and it is still used in July and August during the popular Verona Opera Festival.

Castelvecchio stands overlooking the river with impressive defiance that dates back to the 14th century and reflects the power of the former Scala family.

Day 5: MilanDiscover Charming Verona before Arriving in Elegant Milan

The aroma of cream puffs that are dusted with sugar will fill the streets of Verona in the morning. The morning fills with the sounds of the market-place. The water from the Madonna di Verona fountain trickles in the Piazza delle Erbe, showcasing a famous statue from the Roman era. Your guide will meet you at the hotel and lead you through the city for a private tour that will culminate at the home of Juliet Capulet.



The tunnel, which leads into the courtyard, has letters that are to the matriarch of love who has become a patron for the hopeful and heart-broken around the world. A bronze statue of Juliet stands in the court-yard, reflecting the affection that locals and visitors have for Shakespeare's heroine.



You will travel to the train station by way of a private driver and venture to Milan. The cosmopolitan city shines with culture, architecture, and treasures that date back to the 13th century. The Duomo decorates the central piazza with a flamboyant, Gothic style. The stained-glass windows were crafted between the 15th and 16th centuries and tell stories of the bible in vibrant color. The interior contains the aromas of frankincense and myrrh that accentuate the gold and silverwork in the sacristy.


Milan



Day 6: Milan

Explore the Bustling History and Dynamic Art of Milan

The cultural legacy of the Austro-Hungarian and Napoleonic ages signifies the sophisticated allure through the ages before the Second World War. You will follow your guide through the preserved history of the city, moving between art deco from the post-war redevelopment until reaching the church of Santa Maria delle Grazie, which dates back to the 15th century. The pink-brick exterior shines in the sunlight before you enter the structure and the renowned refectory that hosts Leonardo da Vinci's famous work: the Last Supper.



The captivating work depicts Jesus and his apostles during their final meal. Your guide will help you decipher the meaning of the painting by pointing out the distinct character representations. After visiting the intricate artwork, you will continue to the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, which is a collection of luxury shops that are set beneath a gorgeous dome.

The 19th-century industrial iron and glass architecture creates a vibrant destination where cafes fill the arcade with the aromas of espresso and pastries.

Day 7: Como

Transfer to the Gorgeous Scenery around Lake Como

Your private transfer will greet you in the lobby of your hotel after breakfast and escort you into the luscious landscape of the Italian Alps to reach the charming town of Como, which is located on the shores of Lake Como. The charming town sits on foundations that date back to the 1st century BC. The trees that rise among the surrounding hills fill the cobbled lanes with pine. You can even hear the water from the lake as it laps against the esplanade. Cafes will set out tables and chairs that overlook the water.



You will have a great view of the Rhaetian Alps and the snowcapped peaks that reflect in the water. The charming town has an elegant ambiance that you can explore the during the remainder of your day, taking you along the history of the silk industry to the sophisticated palaces that dot the hillside with Italian art. The cathedral at the heart of town glints with marble and a Romanesque style that supports its Gothic dome. The interior brims with the spiced scent of myrrh that drifts beneath the cross-vaulted nave and tapestries.

Day 8: Como

Traverse the Enchanting Landscape of the Italian Alps

At breakfast, you can find the mouthwatering aromas of frothy cappuccino and cornetto that has been stuffed with Nutella. The remainder of the day will be yours to enjoy the beauty and charms of the villages around Lake Como. You can start by taking the funicular to Brunate. The village is located on top of the scenic mountains, offering remarkable views of the surrounding alpine landscape and the glistening water below. The quiet village almost floats serenely above the lake and is by the tranquil Chiesa di San Andrea that will glow with a faded pink façade. The interior boasts a fabulous, 15th-century fresco and 17th-century paintings that were crafted by the Recchi brothers.



You can continue up the hill on a walk to reach the lighthouse that was built in 1927 and provides an exceptional panorama across Brunate, Como, the water, and the marvelous, rolling summits. The town embodies classic Italian culture in the mountainous terrain with older men gathering to play board games and children kicking soccer balls against the walls. Decorative, iron gates lead to bright doors of private apartments and flower boxes host blossoming buds that decorate the winding walkways, making it the perfect place to sip a glass of Prosecco and enjoy the slower pace of life.

Enjoy the Beautiful Towns and Culture along Lake Como

The neoclassical allure of Villa Olma charms visitors as one of Como's biggest landmarks. The opulent décor dates back to the 18th century in connection to the wealth and power of the Odesalchi family.



Art exhibitions accentuate the established marvels of the Italian interior while the gardens blend both Italian and English design. The English garden possesses a small neoclassical temple and ancient trees that provide shade to visitors who stroll along the paths. The Italian gardens contain symmetrical flowerbeds and a large fountain that is decorated with statues of pagan gods.



The grandeur of Villa Melzi d'Eril also possesses a neoclassical design and remains a highlight for visitors. Azaleas and rhododendrons blossom with lively colors in spring, adding to the elaborate array of statues that adorn the English-style park. After enjoying the enchanting ambiance of the villas in Como, you can travel along the edges of the lake to reach the town of Bellagio, which is a collection of steep, stone staircases that offer views of homes with red roofs, green shutters, cypress trees, and boats. Walking through town will take you to the charismatic church of San Giacomo, which was built between the 11th and 12th centuries while containing 10th-century mosaics and a unique 6th-century altar.

Day 10: Stresa

Indulge in the Gardens and Ambiance of Stresa at Leisure

In the morning, the sounds of the water as they lap against the shoreline will become a tranquil soundtrack to your time along Lake Como before you transfer with your private driver to the town of Stresa. The buildings of the town represent the decadence of the Belle Époque on a serene waterfront that once attracted 19th-century artists and writers. The promenade lines the lake with narrow, cobbled lanes that lead inland to the center where cafes line Piazza Cadorna beneath the shading trees.



The scent of pine fades beneath the aromas of frothy cappuccino and fruity gelato. The day will be yours to enjoy the beauty of the town and the enchanting natural splendor of the mountains and lake.

For a different perspective, you can take the cable car to the top of Mount Mottarone, reaching 16,050 feet above sea level. The crisp mountain air contains hints of crisp, cold, and lush tufts of grass, which provide a fantastic panorama that stretches from the Po Valley to the Alps.

Day 11: Stresa

Visit the Opulent Isola Bella on a Boat Tour of Lake Maggiore

Eager to lead you to the majestic ambiance of the Borromean islands, your guide will greet you in the hotel lobby in the morning and escort you to a boat that will be waiting on Lake Maggiore. Many of the islands on the water remain under the ownership of the Borromeo family, which highlights the power and prestige of the family and the architecture along the islands as you reach Isola Bella.



The Baroque villa at the center of the island uses gardens, the lake, and the surrounding mountains as features the decorate this elegant villa. The palace's grand is an interpretation of the Hanging Gardens of Babylon.

The garden has an authentic, Italian-style spread across ten terraces that reach over 121 feet above the surrounding water. Exotic plants and blossoming flowers will fill the air with a soothing mixture of herbaceous and sweet fragrances. Instead of the lake lapping against the rugged rocks of the island's base, you will hear the tranquil sounds of the fountains as they trickle into their basins beneath the lavish vision of the Baroque statuary.

Venture to Turin for a Lovely Walking Tour Italy's First Capital

Your private transfer will escort you from your hotel along the edges of Lake Maggiore to the classic European city of Turin, which resembles more of a French or Viennese design with wide boulevards that are with green trees and cafes in which students, intellectuals, and chocolate-lovers convene beneath snowcapped peaks of the Alps.



The architecture reflects the connection to contemporary living with an affection toward cuisine, wine culture, and the theories of innovation that are captured in the way baristas find new methods for making delicious coffee. After settling into the comforts of your hotel, your guide will greet you in the lobby and will be interested in introducing you to the splendor of Italy's first capital.



The imposing 1st-century Roman gate of the Porta Palatina remains standing near the cathedral along the main boulevard of Via Garibaldi. The brick archway stands three stories tall and connects a pair of defensive towers. Upon reaching Reggia di Venaria Reale, you will find one of the largest royal residences in the world that once hosted a 17th-century hunting lodge. The jewels of the architecture consist of a vast garden with a stunning fountain of a stag and a museum that possesses over a mile of halls and is known as the Theater of History and Magnificence. It contains over 1,000 years of history that pertains to the Savoy family.

Day 13: TurinWander the Exceptional Museums and Cafes of Turin

In the morning, your guide will direct you to the Museo Egizio, which is the largest collection of Egyptian artifacts on display outside of Cairo. The collection speaks as much to the dynamic culture of Egypt as to the importance of the ancient connections of Italian monarchs.



The galleries inside the Palazzo dell'Accademia delle Scienze display 5,268 artifacts that have been excavated from Egypt and obtained by King Carlo Felice in the 19th century. These depict various gods and pharaohs, including a stunning assemblage of Ramses II.

One of the most captivating features that are on display remains in the tomb of Merit, which was crafted in the 15th century BC. The image was made using layers of plater and linen that were adorned with gold leaf and glass inlays for a reflective, colorful, and intricate portrayal of the royal architect's wife. The modern museum techniques shine a brighter light on the fascinating history of Egypt and its importance in shaping the greater civilizations of the Mediterranean world in ancient and modern times.

Day 1: Bologna
Celebrating Italian Tradition



Bologna is a city of historical majesty and culinary artistry. The medieval arcades contrast the youthful energy emanating from the 11th-century University of Bologna, the oldest university in the world. Your flight lands at Florence Airport. Your private transfer greets you upon arrival and escorts you north to the vibrant city of Bologna, the capital of the Emilia-Romagna region. The Neptune Fountain splashes in a brilliant display of grace and power, embodying the beauty of the 16th-century artistry. Shops along Via dell'Indipendenza offer marvelous window displays promoting fashion and design, turning the window into a work of art. You take the time to settle into your luxurious hotel near the beating heart of the city at Piazza Maggiore and the adjoining Fountain of Neptune. Your private transfer greets you in the lobby and leads you to a shop famous for making perfect hand-made pasta for generations, crafting regional favorites, such as lasagne and tagliatelle.



Your pasta instructor welcomes you with open arms and a large smile. The scent of flour fills the gallery. You learn how to make pasta from "Le Sfogline," traditional pasta makers who introduce you to the art of crafting tortellini. The legend states that the tortellini was shaped after the belly button of Venus, inspired by the goddess in Botticelli's painting, The Birth of Venus. You watch as your instructor quickly makes the dough by whisking eggs inside a volcano of flour, then kneading the dough by hand until it is no longer sticky. You help roll out the dough, eventually imitating your teacher in the way she pinches, twists, and folds the dough to craft a perfect tortellini.

Day 2: Modena
Art of the Racecar

Your guide greets you after breakfast and escorts you to the Maserati factory in Modena to follow in the path of the luxury car with more than 100 years of history. Alfieri Maserati and his brothers started the company in 1914 and began utilizing their mechanical experience in the 1920s after buying a small racecar manufacturer.



The brothers modeled the symbol of the trident after the statue of Neptune in the center of Bologna. The gallery inside the museum houses 19 vintage cars, including the 1934 Maserati 6C-34, the winner of the Modena and Naples Grand Prix. The six-cylinder inline engine offered a lighter and more powerful alternative to any of the other racing cars at the time. After strolling amongst the historical cars, you enter into the red brick building to find the Maserati factory. The antiquated exterior contrasts the modern interior. Wander through the assembly line with your guide, finding the team wheeling the Maserati GranTurismo frames into the factory to begin the building process.



Loudspeakers fill the warehouse with Italian pop music. The workers work, talk, dance, and laugh while attending to the intimate details of their work. In the adjacent building, you find staff members attaching the engines to the transmission and suspension packages. After the tour, you climb into the driver's seat of a brand new Maserati. The leather is cool and comfortable against your back. The gearshift is polished and shines beneath the sunlight piercing the windshield. The engine roars to life, and you take to the rolling hills of the Emilia-Romagna countryside dividing the Apennine Mountains and the northern plains..

In the morning, the aroma of espresso emanates from the cafes, complementing the rich aroma of fresh brioches drifting from the bakeries inside the modern structure housing Mercato delle Erbe. After breakfast, your guide greets you at the hotel and escorts you to the Ducati Factory for insight into how engineers and designers turned a motorcycle into an icon of power, speed, and style. The first gallery gives you a perspective into how the Ducati Company began as a radio component producer, despite repeatedly being bombed during World War II. After Italy's liberation, Ducati shifted their focus from radios to motorcycles, manufacturing its first engine in 1944.



Wander through the timeline of bikes on display before entering the factory. The staff works diligently on the line to produce the perfect Ducati motorcycle each time. You can meet the workers along different assembly phases, listening to the tinkering in the factory that echoes against the walls. You learn about the process of building the engine from start to finish, ensuring each part is accounted for along the assembly line.

The tour ends on the racetrack. The wrench is Bluetooth-enabled to give the engineer an immediate measure as to the amount of torque being applied. A professional driver revs the engine to showcase the power of one of the Ducati bikes available, the Testastretta 11°. You mount the bike and can feel the way the engine purrs beneath you. Your driver revs the engine once more, causing the bike to rumble. You speed along the track, holding tight to your driver with the wind rushing over your helmet and past the sleek, aerodynamic design of the motorcycle.

Day 4: Modena A Culinary Pause

Cuisine around Emilia-Romagna has captured the hearts and stomachs of locals and visitors from around Italy and across the globe. Your tour of the day focuses on the famous gastronomy of the region, beginning with the flavors of celebrated Parmigiano Reggiano cheese, also known as Parmesan cheese. You travel to a private farm to meet the owner and operator of the dairy.



Cows graze on the vast grasslands outside of Modena. The herbaceous scent swirls in the breeze. Your guide leads you through the process of making Parmigiano Reggiano cheese. After milking the cows, the milk rests in large vats overnight. You watch as the staff heats the milk and separate the curds from the steaming liquid. The cheese maker lets the curds cool before straining the cheese through cloth with precise movements. You enter into the warehouse at the end of the tour to find rows of aging Parmesan in the iconic cheese wheels.



The cheese maker finds a wheel that has been immersed in a water and salt bath before knocking against the hard edge of the rind to hear how the cheese has matured. He cuts open the wheel and offers you a taste of the hard, crumbling cheese to find a savory, luscious flavor reminiscent of the landscape outside of Modena. You continue to a balsamic vinegar factory known as an acetaia. The producer greets you warmly and welcomes you into his factory to guide you through the process of making balsamic vinegar. The sweet molasses-like aroma of the vinegar permeates the air in the cellar, where the balsamic ages for up to 50 years, treating the celebrated flavors like sought-after wines..

Iconic Ferrari





Step out of the Ferrari timeline and into a Formula 1 simulator for an unforgettable experience in the Grand Prix. Strap yourself into the seat, hold tight to the wheel, and watch as the street envelopes your view. You can practically feel the rush of the wind as you maneuver the car left and right around the simulated streets. The marvels of the museum continue with a pit-stop experience.

The thrills of the day begin at the Lamborghini museum for an immersive experience beginning with the company's early successes in the early 1960s. Large windows offer a background view into the factory, which frames the vintage cars on display across two stories.



The gleam in the interior stretches over the polished hoods of the antique cars. The cars have been immaculately preserved, even with over 50 years of use, and many of the vehicles are a part of the founder's personal collection. The former tractor company owner used the money from his successful business to build a V12 engine, starting the luxury car company of Lamborghini with a 350 GT on display in the museum.



The racecars decorate the second story where the windows look down onto the factory floor. You continue through the shop to watch the production line and see how the stunning cars are built. Customized leather drapes the seats, complementing the intricate design of the interior. You can watch an engineer move step by step through assembling a V12 Aventador. Explore the power and sleek style of the newly formed Lamborghini around the countryside of Bologna, settling into the smooth comforts of the meticulous details that were measured during assembly. You continue into the countryside to visit a farm known for producing the famous flavors of Parma ham, also known as the delectable tastes of prosciutto..

Today you focus on the gastronomic flavors near the heart of Bologna. The morning returns the youthful ambiance to the city known lovingly as La Grassa, the Fat One. University students sip cappuccinos in a popular cafe and nibble at pistachio biscuits. The markets brim with fish brought from the Adriatic and delectable cheeses brought from the countryside. Your guide meets you at the hotel after breakfast and escorts you to the Mercato delle Erbe, a vibrant produce market where many local Bolognese shop. You find stunning seasonal vegetables, from eggplants in the summer to artichokes in winter and zucchini flowers in spring. The scent of citrus emanates from the pyramid mounds of oranges and lemons.



You sample a soft, crumbly cheese made from sheep's milk to find a delightful burst of tanginess. After selecting your ingredients, you walk to a private kitchen to learn the art of traditional cuisine beyond the pasta you made your first day in Bologna. You craft handmade gnocchi and tagliatelle pasta with a 38" rolling pin. The scent of garlic drifts out of the pot in which you let the broth steep. You watch the friggione, a side dish of potatoes, peppers, and tomatoes, reduce. The sauce of white onions, olive oil, and tomatoes bubbles, nearly ready to top the polenta. After a delicious lunch made by your hand under the guidance of your instructor, you continue your in-depth exploration of Bologna with a private tour beginning in Piazza Maggiore and culminating in the famous 12th-century leaning towers of the Isolani Court.

Artisans of the Motorway at the Pagani Factory

After a traditional breakfast balancing the rich taste of espresso with a sweet brioche, you make your way by private driver to the Pagani museum and factory, located in San Cesario sul Panaro near Modena. The fence bordering the contemporary building opens. The sunlight glints off the upper windows set beneath the flags of flying nations crowning the rooftop. The showroom contains a Pagani Huayra and Zonda R.



The latter was produced between 2009 and 2011 with a 6.0-liter M120 AMG V12 engine that could reach speeds up to 218 miles per hour, with only 15 cars produced in total. Your private guide offers an introduction to the cars on the showroom floor by opening the doors and unlatching the trunk. The rear of the body lifts as if opening the flap of a spaceship to reveal the engine, along with the gas tank. Enter into the smallest section of the garage, where the workmen place the carbon-titanium panels onto the Huayras.



The strong material is surprisingly light, allowing the car to move faster along the open lanes. The engineers and designers are artisans and craftsmen, making a work of art mostly by hand similar to how sculptors use tools to erect breathtaking pieces from stone. A row of cars allows you to view the progress of the assembly, from a body without an interior to the one with an engine, suspension, and wheels. Back in the showroom, you can't help but rub your fingers across the sleek display of the Zonda R, finding a mixture of finesse and power similar to an artistic masterpiece. Your guide explains that Pagani has fewer than 60 employees who help make 15 to 20 cars each year.

Day 9: Bologna
Test Drive on the Track



In the morning, the sunlight washes over the nearly 160-foot tall Garisenda Tower, which leans more than 42 feet from base to top. The tower was built as a status symbol as well as for defensive purposes and continues to adorn the Bologna skyline. The esteem of Italian design has progressed over nine centuries, embodied in the artistic sensibilities of clothing and the fashionable styling of Ferrari, Lamborghini, and Maserati. After breakfast, you venture to a private racetrack connected to Ferrari.



The course leads you on a one and a half mile circuit with five total laps. You get into the Ferrari 458 and rev the V-8 engine to hear it roar. The racecar was designed for the track, speeding from 0–100 km/h (62 mph) in 2.9–3.0 seconds. You grip the wheel tight, feeling the subtle give of the warm leather. You take the car out of the paddock, past the pit lane, and onto your designated lane. A video records your moves. You rev the engine once more, watch for the countdown, and punch it, eager to top out at 340 km/h (210 mph). Even at high speeds, the car moves smoothly.

The walls along the edges of the track turn into a blur. The power of the 570 horsepower spurs you on, shifting gears around the sharper turns and opening it up along the narrow straightaways. You pull the car back into the paddock with your heart still racing with excitement. The engine's roar has diminished to a lingering purr as the car settles to rest. The video recorded your time and best moves from an outside perspective, allowing you to relive the moment.

Upon arrival, you will notice the white walls of circular homes supporting the conical rooftops. These houses are known as Trulli and date back to the Middle Ages, and now more than 1,000 Trulli decorate the hills in the area known as Rione Monti. Restaurants, bars, and hotels fill the enchanting interiors and feel like a home taken out of a fairytale. The white stone walls help insulate the structure, keeping the interior cool in the summer heat and warm in the cold winters.



The scent of rich espresso drifts from the corner bar and towards the neoclassical façade of the Basilica of Saints Cosma and Damiano. You will stop in the Cantina Albea, a wine museum that will bring insight into the traditions of vintners around Puglia with a display of tools that date back to pre-Christian times. Walk through the cantina to view antique oak barrels that add to the layers of the historical and cultural framework of wine. The cool interior offers a warm respite from the Puglian sun, and you can take a seat at a table in the cantina to watch the ruby red color of a local wine fill your glass. Continue to the charming labyrinthine lanes of Locorotondo to wander alongside the whitewashed walls and beneath the windowsills decorated with blossoming pink geraniums.



Tour Marvelous Architecture and Culture in Lecce and Otranto



Wake up in the comforts of your luxurious resort to the sounds of the Adriatic Sea lapping against the nearby beach. The scent of frothy cappuccino fills the dining room at breakfast, accompanied by the aroma of zeppole, a traditional pastry of deep-fried dough topped with powdered sugar. You will make your way to the stunning city of Lecce after your meal, which is often referred to as the Florence of the South due to its elaborate dedication to the arts. The exuberant Baroque architecture shimmers with golden stone most prominent in former palaces and preserved churches.



Cherubs, gargoyles, and griffins adorn the façade of the Basilica di Santa Croce. The ornate columns and cornices give way to the interior that embodies a more classical style. The aroma of frankincense drifts through the nave and you will find harmony in the mixture of the subtle, charming interior as it contrasts with the splendor of the Baroque façade. Restaurants serve traditional orecchiette pasta dressed in a tomato sauce and flavored with pecorino and basil.



Confectionaries display pistachio desserts and cookies dipped in chocolate while papier-mâché decorates the windows of artisan workshops, representing the deep tradition of the art form that dates back to the 17th century. Your instructor will welcome you into the workshop keen on introducing you to the intricacies of papier-mâché, allowing you craft twine and straw to shape unforgettable figurines.

Relish an Olive Oil Tour and Visit Polignano a Mare and Ostuni



The fishing boats will return to the marina at Savelletri in the morning with fishers eager to take their catch to the famous fish market in Bari. The bright turquoise water will capture your eyes at breakfast as you sip your decadent espresso before venturing out of the resort to visit a nearby olive orchard. The serene landscape brings a captivating ambiance as you touch your fingers to the thin, spindly leaves of the olive tree. Nets blanket the ground beneath the branches ready to catch the ripening fruit as it falls away. The villa on the property dates back to the 19th century, and lemon groves thrive in the landscape to add a citrus aroma to the nutty scent that emanates from the olive trees.



Embark on a journey through the historic town of Polignano a Mare. Set sail with the locals, serviced by the experts at Dorino Boat Trips, and coast along the cliffs of Puglia. Along the way, stop and relish in the secluded coves of the Adriatic Sea while enjoying a nice snack and a refreshing swim.



Your guide will show you the mill that processes the ripened olives after harvest, and in the tasting room, a selection of olive oils awaits you. Each small cup is different in viscosity and opacity, and your guide will help you to discern that the aroma of the first oil is slightly paler than the other two while the olive aroma is less prevalent. You can then learn about the three different oils you tasted, with the final being an extra virgin and the only type of olive oil produced on the mill. After the tour, you can wander out to the maze-like city of Ostuni to stroll beneath the archways and alongside the vibrant fruit stalls...

Visit the Town of Matera and Indulge in a Luxurious Resort



You will soon leave behind the shores of the Adriatic Sea and watch the turquoise water and the white sand fade behind the horizon as you journey forward. Your private transfer will take you inland to the region of Basilicata, to reach the town of Matera. Rustic, medieval architecture stands atop a hill that looks east towards the Ionian Sea while narrow streets lead to hidden alleys and wide stairways. Settlers have inhabited the region since before antiquity in cave homes that cover the walls of the gorge, and your guide will lead you along the upper district of town as the medieval architecture decorates the undulating plateau.



You will enter into the Church of San Pietro Barisano for your first introduction to the subterranean life of the historical city, and the spiced scent of myrrh lingers in the nave. 15th and 16th-century frescos decorate the entrance level that leads to an empty frame where the altarpiece originally stood while catacombs below the church provide insight into the history of burials in a town that sits atop the hard stone.



You will make your way out of the church and down to the lower level of the city to view the Stassi, the rock districts. The inhabitants of Matera have inhabited the caves since the Middle Ages with unique views to the Gravina Valley below. The mouth of the caves frame the colorful doors and resemble a city carved out of rock instead of homes made from caves. You will enter into Casa-Grotta di Vico Solitario to find a reproduction of life in the city leading up to the mid-20th century.

Venture to Maratea, the Ionian Sea, and a Classic Cooking Class

Enjoy the wonder of your hotel as you wake up in the splendor of a 19th-century villa located in the town of Bernalda. Outside of the hotel, old men gather in the piazza to talk politics and soccer while sipping strong espresso. Exotic plants grow in the private gardens and offer a view over the rugged hills and sporadic vineyards that are growing in the valley.



The town of Maratea contrasts with the rugged and isolated atmosphere of the region as a collection of coastal villages overtakes the 19-mile long stretch of the Tyrrhenian Sea. The cliffs shelter the coves and provide stunning viewpoints while 44 ancient hilltop churches provide a sense of history alongside the extraordinary beauty of the shoreline. Your private driver will lead you through the collection of villages to view the Basilica of San Biagio, the main church in the district.



You can see the outline of the 22-foot tall Christ the Redeemer statue above as the church was originally erected in the 6th century and carries a soft-spoken grandeur in the serene ambiance. As you wander back to streets, colorful ceramics create elaborate window displays in the shops around town, and you can walk along the beach and dig your toes into the grainy black sand of Macarro beach. In the afternoon, you will meet a celebrated chef ready to introduce you to the traditional cuisine of Maratea and Basilicata in his kitchen. 

Day 9: RavelloDiscover History and Charming Beauty on the Isle of Capri

In the morning, you will board a ferry to reach the island of Capri. The dramatic coastal cliffs reach heights up to 200 feet tall, striking a dramatic image before the horizon before the ferry docks at the jetty that leads to Marina Grande. Adorable homes line the golden sands and lead into the ridges of the cliff that overlook the water as small, colorful boats dress the beach at low tide. The funicular carries you to the Piazzetta at the top of the cliff where cafes set out tables and chairs for views to the water. The scent of lemon cream tarts and flavorful espresso overtake the square, and you will immediately understand the allure of the legendary island known for captivating Hollywood starlets and Roman emperors alike.



Take your time to stroll along the narrow cobbled lanes of Capri Town to view the luxury boutiques while the aroma of pine and sweet oranges emanates from the artisan perfume shop. The tradition of the sweet scents on the island date back to the 15th century with monks in the Charterhouse of San Giacomo utilizing herbs and flowers. Experience the Villa Jovis, the former palace of Emperor Tiberius in the 1st century AD as the complex encompasses terraces that overtake nearly two acres and reach an elevation of more than 130 feet tall.
